## THE RUDDELL HISTORY

Taken from reference books in Stockton, Calif. furnished by Attorney Foltz.
Complied in 1956 by Grace Dotts Ruddell

The CORNELIUS born July 4, 1804 is Grandfather to the sons and daughters of WILLIAM RUDDELL born Aug. 20, 1837, in Boone County, Kentucky. This CORNELIUS'-father is JAMES RUDDELL born Aug. 20, 1756, and wife JANE born Jan. 25, 1761.

JAMES RUDDELL born in 1756 is Great Great Grandfather of sons and daughters of WILLIAM RUDDELL born Aug. 20, 1837. It is thought Great Grandfather JAMES born in 1756 is a brother to Captain ISSAC and Captain GEORGE RUDDELL. Also brother to ARCHIBALD and CORNELIUS and son of ARCHIBALD, son of THOMAS.

In 1700 THOMAS RUDDELL came to Virginia on an 'English' boat. He had four sons, ARCHIBALD, GEORGE, CORNELIUS and JOHN.

Gaptain ISSAC RUDDELL (RUDDLE, RIDDLE, RUDDILL - note different spellings down through the years) went from Shenandoah county Virginia to Kentucky in 1777. In April 1779, assisted by JOHN BURGER, he began founding RUDDELL'S STATION, Harrison County, Kentucky, where Captain JOHN HINKSON, from Monomgahels, had made an improvement in 1775 but had abandoned it.

Col. HENRY BYRD and SIMON GIRTY, with 600 Indians and Canadians, captured RUDDELL'S STATION, June 22, 1780. A demand to surrender was answered by Captain RUDDELL that he would do so only on condition prisoners would be under protection of the British troop and not turned over to the Indians. This was agreed.

As soon as thestation's gates were opened the Indians began looting and siezing screaming women and children. Upon RUDDELL'S remonstrance, Col. BYRD confessed the Indians were out of his control. MARTIN'S STATION was next taken by British force. The Indians pressed the capture of BRYAN'S STATION, but BYRD refused.

At the forks of Licking, Kentucky, prisoners were given to the Indians, Captain HINKSON alone making his escape. The remainder were taken to Detroit, where they were not released until after four years. A number, including some from Shenandoah County, remained with the Savages. Col. BYRD himself married one of the captives.

Captain ISSAC RUDDELL was a captive in CLARK'S regiment. He married ELIZABETH, sister of Col. JOHN BOWMAN, of Kentucky. Their issue was Captain GEORGE, STEPHEN, ABRAM, ELIZABETH, JOHN, ISSAC, CORNELIUS and an unnamed infant in his mother's arms killed at the capture. Captain GEORGE RUDDELL, born in 1757 in Shenandoah, married THEODOSIA LYNN at RUDDELL'S STATION, April 12, 1779 and the newlyweds were among the captives. They died in Independence County, Arkansas. ELIZABETH RUDDELL, married JOHN MULHERRIN, whose children lived in Pike County, Missouri. JOHN RUDDELL who was out withCol. JOHN TODD, escaped the attact, and settled in New Madrid County, Missouri, where his daughter married a VAN BIBBER. CORNELIUS RUDDELL was born after the return. All the children except JOHN and CORNELIUS RUDDELL were taken prisoners.

All were released in 1784 except ABRAN and STEPHEN, who grew up with the Indians, remaining with them until grown men. ABRAM married a squaw, was a spy and interpreter for HARRISON in the was of 1812, and died in southern Missouri or northern Arkansas. He never becam 'civilized', but was always in a manner an uncouth Indian.

Rev. STEPHEN RUDDELL was born in 1768 in Shenandoah. He met TECUMSEH when both were 12 years old and grew up in the same village with him. RUDDELL was with the Indians in several Indian fights against the whites. After returning to Kentucky, he was converted to Christianity about 1800, was given some education and became a Baptist preacher.

From 1805 to 1811 he made yearly missionary visits to the Shawnee and Delewares and introduced Christianity among them. He acted as interpreter for JOHN JOHNSTON, Indian agent at Upper Piqua during the war of 1812. He preached in Kentucky, Ohio, Missouri, Indiana and Illinois, dying in Adams County, Illinois, 1845. He married an Indian, who returned from Kentucky to the Indians. Rev. STEPHEN RUDDELL'S son, JOHN M. RUDDELL, represented Adams County in the Illinois House of Representatives, 1846-1848. The people of Bourbon County, Kentucky remembers with respect the Rev. STEPHEN RUDDELL.

 ${\sf GEORGE}$  W. RUDDELL represented Nicholas County in the Kentucky House of Representatives in 1836.

CORNELIUS RUDDELL was Captain for the Shenandoah area during the French and Indian war. GEORGE RUDDELL was Justice of Shenandoa- during the Revolution. Captain CORNELIUS RUDDELL was instrumental in having an act for establishing the town of Woodstock, in Fredrick County, Virginia......"and be it further enacted, by the authority aforesaid that CORNELIUS RIDDEL, JOHN SKEEN, BURR HARRISON, etc., gentlemen shall be, and they are hereby, nominated, constituted and appointed, directors and trustees for the said town,".....there is a graph, with lots purchased in Woodstock with how much paid. CORNELIUS RUDDELL paid 20 for lot 79.

Virginia, dated April 17, 1772, as listed in the early records at Woodstock, also a land transfer, GEORGE RUDDELL and wife to ABRAHAM BIRD.

On June 14. 1814, GEORGE RUDDELL was recorded Captain in the 2nd. Batt. and 13th. Regt. V.M. in the room of A. DOYLE, resigned; ELEAZER DOWNEY Lieut., in room of GEORGE RUDDELL, promoted ...etc.

At a court of OYER and TERMINER, held at the courthouse on Set. 7, 1814, for the trial of JOE, a negro man slave the property of CHARLES BEESLY, charged with attempting to raise and insurrection. Present: ISAAC SAMUELS, JACOB RINKER, JACOB RINKER, JR., BENJAMINE PENNYBACKER and GEORGE RUDDELL General Justice.

CLARA RUDDELL. MOUNCE BYRD, SR., died 1793, who resided on Smiths Creek in Shenandoah County, Virginia, married CLARA RUDDELL, and had four daughters (SARAH, wife of JOHN MOORE; INGIBO, wife of ISSAC GOARE; MARGARET, wife of CORNELIUS NEWMAN; MAGDALENE, who married -1st. JOHN TAYLOR, and 2nd. BENJAMIN HAWKINS;) and four sons (Captain ABRAHAM, who married MARY JONES; and MOUNCE JR., who resided at "The Forge" married HANNAH PENNYBACKER, and had a large family.)


